FROM THE ARTISTIC DIRECTOR Jennaya Robison

Dear friends of the National Lutheran Choir,



The 2023-2024 season, "All Things New," was born from the words of the NLC mission to celebrate, invigorate and expand sacred choral music. As a product of the Lutheran choral tradition, I am firmly rooted in uplifting the magnificence of that tradition. At the same time, it is my goal to cultivate a welcoming space where people of all faith traditions, or no tradition at all, feel part of the NLC community. Our season includes

both celebrated works from the sacred canon as well as repertoire that will stretch our imaginations as we explore the sacred voices of secular poets, shared experiences of humanity, and diverse faith and ethnic traditions.

Our season will be a four-concert journey celebrating choral tradition while also opening up the conversation of what is sacred. We'll explore how to create a community that truly welcomes all of God's people. The season will begin with an All Saints concert that commemorates our saints and celebrates the new life of all those who have been born. At Christmas, we anticipate the new hope given to all of us in the form of a new baby. In winter, we will honor music of the sacred, Lutheran tradition alongside works of underrepresented American composers. Finally, we will end our season with the Midwest premiere of Minnesota-based composer Jocelyn Hagen's work *Here I Am*. This concert will feature a partnership with members of the nationally recognized Angelica Cantanti Youth Choirs - Treble Singers under the direction of Philip Brown and Grammy Awardwinning soprano soloist, Sarah Brailey.

As we enter this first season together, let me be the first to thank you for your continued support and enthusiasm for the work we do as the National Lutheran Choir community:



Take a journey with the National Lutheran Choir before our departure to the Carolinas to celebrate music of the Lutheran canon and works from American composers. The NLC's tour program will explore the connections we make through the narratives of our lives, all of us one community in friendship and spirit. Works from Schütz, Gretchaninoff, and Paulus will complement newer works by Stacey Gibbs and Zanaida Robles, as well as three movements from *The Lost Birds* choral set by Christopher Tin.

Hagen's work seeks the feminine, bringing to light the love and power God has bestowed on women throughout history and in our lives today. This piece will be paired with movements from *Dixit Dominus* by Mariana von Martines, an undersung, yet brilliant, Classical-era composer.

BIOGRAPHIES



NATIONAL LUTHERAN CHOIR

The National Lutheran Choir is rooted in its mission to celebrate, invigorate, and expand sacred choral music, bringing inspiration and meaning to people of diverse faiths and backgrounds. Founded in 1986 by the late Larry Fleming, grown under the direction of David Cherwien from 2002-2023, and now led by Jennaya Robison, the National Lutheran Choir sings a spiritual story through diverse repertoire including selections from early chant and simple folk anthems to complex choral masterworks and new compositions. Currently in its 38th year, the National Lutheran Choir features a roster of more than 65 volunteer singers from various backgrounds and faith traditions. In addition to concertizing in the Twin Cities and on annual tours, the choir serves a national audience through artfully produced content, concert live streams, and other releases on YouTube, as well as through a Virtual Subscription program. A discography of 36 recordings showcases the ensemble's music making over the years and presents hymns, choral classics, contemporary works, spirituals, and major new works commissioned by the National Lutheran Choir. Much of this influential new work is featured in MorningStar Music's collection, "The National Lutheran Choir Series." The National Lutheran Choir has been honored with the Wittenberg Award from the Luther Institute, Chorus America's Margaret Hillis Award, and the Dale Warland Singers Commissioning Award.


DR. JENNAYA ROBISON, ARTISTIC DIRECTOR

Jennaya Robison is the Artistic Director of the National Lutheran Choir and is a highly accomplished conductor, educator, and vocalist. She holds degrees in conducting, voice, and music education from the University of Arizona, the University of New Mexico, and Luther College. Her work in choral conducting includes serving as the Raymond R. Neevel/Missouri Associate Professor and Director of Choral Studies at the University of Missouri-Kansas City Conservatory from 2020 to 2023, serving as Associate Professor of Choral Music at Luther College from 2013 to 2020, and founding Scottsdale Musical Arts in 2009.

In demand as a clinician and guest speaker, Robison frequently appears at regional and national choral conferences and seminars; leads All State and honor choirs, workshops, and festivals; and has taught courses in choral singing and global connection in the United States, Namibia, South Africa, and Germany. She is an active arranger of choral music and the editor of both the "National Lutheran Choir Series" with MorningStar Music and the "Jennaya Robison Series" with Pavane Publishing. Robison has served as soloist and chorister with the Dale Warland Singers, True Concord Voices, Spire Chamber Ensemble, the Tucson Symphony, and many other ensembles. She is the national chair of Music and Worship for the American Choral Directors Association and a member of Chorus America. Robison has also previously held leadership positions at Lutheran churches in Arizona, Missouri, Iowa, and Minnesota.
